

Azerbaijanis are perhaps the most open of all these peoples to the Gospel.

They live in a beautiful region full of contrasts. From majestic mountain ranges to fertile river valleys and coastal plains, the Azerbaijani people have been shaped by the land they live in. They are tenacious and resilient, yet generous and hospitable. Their music and art overflows from their love for their land.

Only about a quarter of the Azerbaijanii people actually live in the Republic of Azerbaijan. The highest concentration of them live in Iran. Azerbaijanis are a gateway people with the potential to reach the unreached peoples of Iran, Caucasus, Central Asia, and even the Middle East.

From the mountains of Ararat and the Azeri region of Naxchevan (named from the old Azeri words Nuh chixan, "where Noah came out," based on <u>Genesis 8:4</u>), to the highest echelon of power in Iran (the supreme leader, Ayatollah Khameini, is an Azeri), Azerbaijanis are a people who shouldn't be ignored.

Although national boundaries present challenges to Western workers, they aren't so problematic to Azerbaijani believers. Natives from Azerbaijan go to Iran and share the good news of Jesus. Pastors from Baku go to northern Iraq and are welcomed as brothers rather than foreigners. Azerbaijanis from Baku share their faith in Georgia, having freedom to do so without government intervention.

Estimates of the number of Azerbaijani believers worldwide range from 7,000 to 14,000.

## Yet a growing number have recently come to faith in Christ.

Recent events have brought new challenges and diminished the free flow of people and ideas in the region: renewed persecution in Iran and war between Azerbaijan and Armenia over the disputed territory of Nagorno-Karabakh.

Nevertheless, we continue to see growth and maturation in Azerbaijan's church. In many ways, they really are God's gateway people to the Muslim world.
